We also hosted various training camps, seminars, and technical workshops, including the widely participated AFTU Online Free Seminar in Poomsae & Freestyle, which engaged 700 participants.

OPERATIONS REPORT

This section of the report meticulously highlights the diverse administrative, leadership, and political initiatives undertaken and/or organized by the African Taekwondo Union (AFTU) within the period of May 2023 to September 2024. These activities played an essential role in advancing the profile of African taekwondo, fostering strategic partnerships, and promoting the sport across the continent and internationally.

- 1. Strengthening AFTU's Administrative Foundation: During this period, AFTU's administrative operations were significantly enhanced to ensure streamlined processes and increased efficiency. The union established robust communication channels between its Member National Associations (MNAs) and World Taekwondo (WT). This was complemented by regular administrative meetings and updates, ensuring that decisions and policies were uniformly implemented across the continent.
 - Implementation of Digital Platforms: AFTU introduced digital platforms to modernize administrative tasks, providing MNAs with easy access to information, resources, and updates regarding competitions, seminars, and events. This shift toward digitization also facilitated transparent reporting and a unified database of African taekwondo athletes, coaches, and officials.
 - Leadership Coordination: The AFTU leadership convened regularly to discuss strategic goals, future activities, and the alignment of African taekwondo's objectives with those of World Taekwondo. These meetings ensured that AFTU remained an agile and responsive organization capable of navigating the complexities of international sports administration.
- **2. Political and Leadership Engagements:** The leadership of AFTU, led by President IDE Issaka, participated in various high-level political and leadership engagements that not only solidified AFTU's position in the global taekwondo ecosystem but also fostered stronger relationships with key stakeholders.
 - Participation in World Taekwondo Council and Executive Meetings: President IDE Issaka, representing AFTU, participated in multiple World Taekwondo Council meetings, including the Extraordinary Council Meeting held in Chuncheon, Korea, in August 2023. These meetings provided a platform for AFTU to advocate for the interests of African taekwondo within the global governance structure of World Taekwondo. Through active participation, AFTU contributed to major decisions, including the election of host cities for global events such as the World Taekwondo Grand Prix Final
 - African Leadership Engagements: AFTU took part in various continental and regional summits aimed at fostering collaboration between African sports organizations and national governments. The AFTU Mission to Madagascar in August 2023 served as a significant example, where key discussions took place regarding government support for taekwondo infrastructure development, further solidifying political backing for the sport across the continent.
- **3.** Collaboration with International Bodies: AFTU engaged in multiple strategic collaborations with international bodies to further the development of taekwondo in Africa. The union actively participated in international forums, which resulted in significant cooperation agreements and partnerships.
 - AFTU & KPNP Cooperation Agreement (August 2023): A groundbreaking cooperation agreement with KPNP was formalized in Seoul, South Korea. This partnership marked a turning point in the technological enhancement of African taekwondo, with the adoption of state-of-the-art electronic

- scoring systems, ensuring fairer competitions and greater efficiency in major tournaments such as the African Games Accra 2023.
- World Taekwondo Cultural Festival Agreement (August 2023): AFTU leadership was also present at the Gangwon Chuncheon 2023 World Taekwondo Cultural Festival, where the relocation of World Taekwondo's headquarters was signed. This marked a significant moment in global taekwondo governance, with AFTU positioning itself as a key player in WT's cultural and structural evolution.
- **4. Organizing Key Continental and Global Events:** In addition to participating in international meetings, AFTU took on an active role in organizing key events that attracted international attention and placed African taekwondo on the world stage.
 - African Qualification Tournament & Head of Teams Meeting for Paris 2024 (February 2024): The African Qualification Tournament held in Dakar, Senegal, saw athletes from across the continent compete for spots in the Paris 2024 Olympic Games. The event was organized in collaboration with WT and was a testament to AFTU's organizational capabilities. The Head of Teams Meeting held in parallel also provided critical updates on the preparation for Paris 2024, with the participation of high-ranking officials from World Taekwondo, including President Dr. Chungwon Choue.
 - Senegal Open and Grand Prix Challenge (July 2023): This high-profile event, held in Dakar, Senegal, served as a major continental competition, providing African athletes with the opportunity to prepare for international events. The competition witnessed exceptional performances and fostered greater unity within the African taekwondo community.
- **5.** Advocacy for Grassroots Development and Gender Inclusion: AFTU continued to prioritize grassroots development and gender inclusion throughout its activities. One of the key initiatives during this period was the AFTU Women Promotion Program spearheaded by Ms. Gladys Njoroge, which aimed to empower and increase female participation in taekwondo across Africa.
 - Youth and Women's Empowerment: AFTU organized multiple grassroots programs, including the AFTU Youth Training Camp in May 2024 in Dakar, Senegal, which brought together promising young athletes from across the continent. These initiatives have been vital in nurturing future taekwondo champions and promoting gender equality within the sport.
- **6. Recognition and Awards:** AFTU's efforts did not go unnoticed, as the union received various recognitions and honors for its work. At the **Peace and Sport Awards 2023** held in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, AFTU's initiatives promoting peace through sport were highlighted, with AFTU being recognized as a leading organization in Africa for fostering social cohesion through taekwondo.

Conclusion: The period from May 2023 to September 2024 has been a pivotal time for AFTU, marked by outstanding achievements in the fields of administration, leadership, and political engagement. AFTU's participation in international forums, the successful organization of continental competitions, and its efforts to promote grassroots development have solidified its role as a major driving force in the global taekwondo community.

Through its continuous efforts, AFTU has strengthened its presence both on the African continent and on the global stage, fostering unity, inclusivity, and progress in the sport of taekwondo. Looking forward, AFTU remains committed to furthering the development of taekwondo in Africa and ensuring that the continent continues to produce world-class athletes and leaders in the sport.

c) World Taekwondo Symposium focus on positive vale of Taekwondo and its future

BAKU, Azerbaijan (May 28, 2023) - World Taekwondo today hosted the World Taekwondo Symposium which brought together expert academic speakers to discuss the positive value of Taekwondo and ideas for its future based on scientific research.

The Symposium was opened by World Taekwondo Education Committee Chair and President of the French Taekwondo Association Hassane Sadok who provided an analysis of the existing academic research which has been conducted into Taekwondo. Sadok looked at how research into performance analysis and injury prevention and other key areas is providing a greater understanding of the benefits of Taekwondo practice.

Hadwah Moawad, Chair of Taekwondo For All and World Taekwondo Para Taekwondo Classification Committee, presented on Taekwondo for Better life and the 12 strategies implemented by World Taekwondo to improve quality of life in both the external and internal dimensions.

Hyun Chul Jung, Professor, College of Physical Education at Kyung Hee University presented the scientific development in Taekwondo studies across the three main areas of research: 1) Athletic Performance, 2) Preventing sports injury and 3) Health promotion.

Mohsen Kazemi, Professor, Canadian Memorial Chiropractic College, assessed the impact of weight classifications in Taekwondo and posited that based on the data available it could be worth considering pursuing categorisation based on height.

The final presentation was delivered by Paul Viscogliosi, Medical Doctor, Specialist in Emergency Trauma, who looked at the evolution of safety in Taekwondo competitions and how the changes to Taekwondo competitions has significantly reduced injuries in the sport.

World Taekwondo President Chungwon Choue thanked the speakers for their presentations and emphasised the importance of the World Taekwondo Symposium which he launched nearly 20 years ago to encourage greater academic research and engagement on Taekwondo.

The Symposium concluded with an interactive panel discussion with speakers taking questions from the audience.

The organization of the SENEGAL OPEN and the GRAND PRIX CHALLENGE took place in optimal conditions and was a great success, thanks to our Official Sponsor ERIC FAVRE (Eric Favre Sénégal). The African Taekwondo Union and the Senegalese Taekwondo Federation sincerely thank you for your generous contribution.

This was a very important competition because it enabled us to carry out this activity that the WT had requested in order to allow the athletes to take part in the Grand Prix in Paris and also to pick up some very important points on the ramking. The Senegalese Taekwondo Federation has done an excellent job in making this challenge a success. President IDE Issaka congratulates the AFTU technical teams for their professionalism and commitment to meeting the major challenges.









III. World Taekwondo Council convened today for an Extraordinary meeting: "18 August, 2023 in CHUNCHEON, Korea.

CHUNCHEON, Korea (Aug 18, 2023) – The World Taekwondo Council convened today for an Extraordinary meeting that marked several significant milestones, including the awarding of the inaugural World Virtual Championships in 2024 to Singapore, and the approval of the Implementation Agreement with Chuncheon on the Relocation of the headquarters of World Taekwondo.

The Council meeting took place in a hybrid format on the opening day of the Gangwon-Chuncheon World Taekwondo Cultural Festival. In addition to the Council members, the meeting was attended by **IOC Vice President Ser Miang Ng**.

The creation of the World Taekwondo Virtual Championships, meanwhile, follows the success of the discipline at the first-ever Olympic Esports Week (OEW) in Singapore, where Virtual Taekwondo delivered the most memorable highlights of the event. Singapore will host the inaugural edition in 2024, with dates to be decided at a later stage.

World Taekwondo President Chungwon Choue said:

"Congratulations to Singapore on the awarding of the first-ever World Taekwondo Virtual Championships. Following the resounding success of the Olympic Esports Week in Singapore, I can think of no better host to stage this important new event and bring Virtual Taekwondo to the world. This is a key milestone for Taekwondo which reflects our commitment to innovation and engaging new audiences."

During the meeting, the Council also approved the Implementation Agreement on the Relocation of the headquarters of World Taekwondo. The agreement follows an extensive bid and evaluation process, in which Chuncheon was selected based on its strong Taekwondo heritage and high scores across the evaluation criteria of sustainability, suitability, facility infrastructure and expected impact.

Chuncheon was also awarded the World Taekwondo Octagon Diamond Games, the World Taekwondo Demonstration Team Championships and the World Para Taekwondo Open Challenge from 2024 to 2026. The Host City Contract was signed by World Taekwondo President Chungwon Choue and Chuncheon Mayor Donghan Yook.

Meanwhile, the World Taekwondo Council welcomed **Athletes Committee co-chairs Wu Jingyu and Cheick Cisse, who are now ex-officio members on the Council** to ensure that the athlete voice is represented at the highest level within the federation.

Finally, the Council received reports on World Taekwondo's Safeguarding Initiative, which is a strategic follow up to the Hammamet Declaration on Safe Sport that it announced in 2018. The Safeguarding Initiative sees 13 representatives from World Taekwondo's administration and Continental Unions who will undertake the IOC Safeguarding Certification program.

The next World Taekwondo Council meeting will be held on 11 May 2024 in Muju, Korea.









IV. AFTU & KPNP COOPERATION AGREEMENT: "19 August, 2023 in SEOUL, South Korea.

The African Taekwondo Union, represented by its President, Mr IDE Issaka, Mr Driss EL HILALI (1st Vice-President AFTU) and Mr Balla DIEYE (Secretary General AFTU), and the Korean brand KPNP officially signed a contract in Seoul on Saturday August 19, 2023.

AFTU is proud to be associated with a brand that has been recognized for many years, having already demonstrated its expertise in Taekwondo.















V.Implementation Agreement on Relocation of Headquarters of World Taekwondo signed at Gangwon Chuncheon 2023 World Taekwondo Cultural Festival "19 August, 2023 in CHUNCHEON, Korea.

CHUNCHEON, Korea (Aug 19, 2023) - World Taekwondo President Chungwon Choue and Chuncheon Mayor Donghan Yook signed an Implementation Agreement on the Relocation of the headquarters of World Taekwondo to Chuncheon during the Opening Ceremony of the Gangwon Chuncheon 2023 World Taekwondo Cultural Festival.

The purpose of the agreement is to establish the rights and obligations of World Taekwondo and the city of Chuncheon, Gangwon State with an aim of relocating headquarters of World Taekwondo to Chuncheon Songam Sports Town in the City of Chuncheon.

Chuncheon plans to construct a four-story building with a gross floor area of approximately 3,100m2 to host the federation. Construction would take place from 2024-2027 and would see a performance hall, memorial hall, exhibition room, reception and rest area on the first and second floors, with the third and fourth floors reserved for office spaces, and various types of meeting rooms. The rooftop will have a garden and observatory facility.

Chuncheon hopes to enhance the image of the city through its hosting of the headquarters of World Taekwondo and develop the Headquarters into a tourist attraction which hosts various types of international events. Chuncheon will provide integrated education programs to promote the values of body, virtue and knowledge through practising Taekwondo and promote the growth of Taekwondo as an industry.

Speaking following the ceremony, World Taekwondo President Choue said:

"Chuncheon City has hosted many international and domestic Taekwondo competitions over the past few decades and with the establishment of the headquarters of World Taekwondo here we will significantly increase the synergies between Chuncheon City and our federation."


VII. AFTU Mission for the 13th African Games "ACCRA 2023" " 4 October, 2023 in GHANA.










IX. AFTU MISSION IN MOSCOW " 23-27 October, 2023 in RUSSIA.





The Head of Team Meeting for the African Qualification Tournament marked a crucial step towards the Paris 2024 Olympic Games. 






XIX. AFTU YOUTH TRAINING CAMP, from May 19 to 30, 2024 in Dakar/SENEGAL.









XXI. AFTU Online Free Seminar in Poomsae & Freestyle, from September 14 to 15, 2024.










XXII. Some facts of the year 2024.
