(D) This Code shall continue to apply to any ineligible Participant and any violation committed during a period of suspension or ineligibility shall be treated as a distinct violation and separate proceedings may be brought against the Participant in accordance with this Code.

(E) Once the period of the Participant's ineligibility or suspension has expired, he or she will become automatically re-eligible to participate in Taekwondo provided that he or she has:

- <u>completed toWorld Taekwondo's</u> <u>satisfaction any official integrity</u> <u>education imposed on him or her as a</u> <u>sanction by the World Taekwondo</u> <u>disciplinary body;</u>
- paid, in full, any fine imposed under this Code and/or any order of costs

	 made against him or her by the World Taekwondo disciplinary body; and agreed to subject himself or herself to any reasonable and proportionate monitoring of his or her future activities in connection with Taekwondo as World Taekwondo may reasonably consider necessary given the nature and scope of the violation that he or she has committed.
