## **Executive Summary**

The World Taekwondo (WT) Development Program is a comprehensive initiative aimed at fostering the sustainable growth of Taekwondo globally. Aligned with the values of excellence, integrity, respect, tolerance, inclusiveness, and leadership, WT collaborates with Continental Unions (CUs), Member National Associations (MNAs), and other stakeholders to implement development programs. The Member Relations & Development Department oversees nine programs designed to enhance stakeholder capabilities, promote global Taekwondo events, and cultivate talent from grassroots to elite levels.




Figure 1. Budget Distribution Across Each Development Program 2023

The programs include equipment provision, financial support for participation in the annual WT General Assembly (GA) and WT Championships (Senior and Cadet), athlete scholarships for training and participation in competitions, and assistance for vulnerable communities, refugees, and Para Taekwondo athletes. In 2023, a total of 35 MNAs, 5 CUs with 16 different projects, and 16 athletes were directly supported with a total spent budget of USD 1,081,211 (see Fig. 1).

The Development Program strategically allocates funds to enhance stakeholder capabilities, facilitate participation in events, and nurture talent across various levels. In summary, the program effectively aligns with WT's mission, fostering the sustainable growth of Taekwondo on a global scale.







## 7. Continental Union (CU) Development Fund

#### **Purpose**



• To support CUs to carry out their operations as well as to support the MNAs in their respective continents.

#### **Eligibility**



- Each CU is entitled to receive funding in proportion to the number of MNAs on its continent.
- The fund is allocated upon receipt of the completed applications and project plans.

## 8. WT Cares Program

#### **Purpose**




 To provide Taekwondo education and equipment to vulnerable communities, such as orphans, street children, reformatory inmates, drug and alcohol addicts, women victims of violence, etc., in developing countries.

#### **Eligibility**



- Applying MNAs should be from **Asia** due to the funds being supported by the **Asia Development Foundation (ADF).**
- Projects could be expanded to countries from other continents on a case-by-case basis.

## 8. WT Cares Program

### 1

#### Pakistan (Care for Those Who Dare)

- Duration: 1 year
- Aim: to empower orphans and children from rural areas and give them an opportunity for life improvement
- Participants: around 1,000 children



#### Sri Lanka (Road to Champion)

- Duration: 1 year
- Aim: to empower street children and vulnerable youth affected by war, discrimination, and exploitation
- Participants: 100 young people





#### **Bhutan (Road to Recovery through Taekwondo)**

- Duration: 7 months
- Aim: to support people at alcohol and drug rehab centers and to enhance education at schools
- Participants: 144 young people





### Kyrgyzstan (Dream through Taekwondo)

- Duration: 7 months
- Aim: to provide orphans with the opportunity to foster family warmth, health, and dreams
- Participants: 120 orphan children



### Mongolia (Bright Future with Taekwondo)

- Duration: 7 months
- Aim: to provide reformatory inmates a pathway to reintegrate to society
- Participants: 100-120 reformatory inmates



#### **Nepal (Um Hong Gil Human School Project)**

- Duration: 7 months
- Aim: to use Taekwondo as a tool for life improvement and education in sports, peace, and Olympic values
- Participants: 50 students

#### **Purpose**




 To ensure the global growth of Para Taekwondo and provide athletes with a pathway to the international stage.

## Conclusion

The World Taekwondo (WT) Development Program is a practical initiative orientated towards the global growth of Taekwondo. Managed by the Member Relations & Development Department, it consists of nine programs, including equipment provision, financial support, scholarships, and targeted initiatives like the Refugee Solidarity Program, WT Cares Program, and Para Taekwondo Development Funds. These efforts aim to boost stakeholder capabilities, encourage global participation, and nurture talent across different levels.

The 2023 report highlights important achievements, with 35 Member National Associations (MNAs), 5 Continental Unions (CUs), and 16 athletes benefiting from an allocated budget of USD 1,081,211. However, challenges persist, such as assisting MNAs with visa issues, addressing complexities in aiding refugee athletes, and dealing with delays in equipment provision due to shipping.

Despite these challenges, the Development Program effectively aligns with WT's mission. It strategically allocates funds to meet its goals, reflecting WT's commitment to excellence and inclusiveness. As WT continues its dedication to Taekwondo's global growth, the Development Program plays an important role in achieving these objectives.
