- · What it takes to stage the Olympic Games
- The benefits of hosting the Olympic Games/ benefits of an Olympic Candidature
- · Frequently asked questions / misconceptions
- · No commitment to bid but better informed decision making

A progressive candidature in 3 stages:

- · Progressive development, on-going dialogue, assistance
- Each stage will address different elements of the cities' proposals in the context of the inherent nature of each country, region and city
- · The possibility for cities to «course correct» during the process

Outcome?

- · Allows each city to present its best individual value proposition
- Result: reduced costs for Candidate Cities and a more mature & better prepared OCOG

- K41 K44 classes are the only ones considered for the Paralympic and Parapan American Games

What is the difference from other WTF events?

- NOT MUCH!
- · Requires set up for both Poomsae and Kyorugi
 - Using same equipment and Referees as for regular athletes
- Officials
 - WTF Certified International Classifiers required
 - Teams will bring extra support staff for high need athletes
- · Combined with other Championships
 - Possible to combine the WTF World Para-Taekwondo Championships with other events
