Career History

Date Sept 2017 to Present: Australian Taekwondo.

Position: National Coaching Director

The first six months were spent visiting each state to learn about the Australian taekwondo and Institute/Academy of Sport landscape. In December 2017, we ran the first camp for identified national categorised athletes at the Australian Institute of Sport (AIS). Our first overseas competition was in February 2018 to the Sofia and Dutch Open Championships, where we were successful in gaining a 3rd place as a team.

As a result of the initial review of the taekwondo landscape, a decision was made, with funding from the AIS to establish a new national high-performance training hub in Melbourne, where all the key athletes now train. This hub incorporates a key relationship with the Victorian Institute of Sport which provides sport specific support services. In addition, I am leading a shift in philosophy surrounding competition at major events. We have established the World Championships as an event that only athletes that are internationally competitive will attend, rather than athletes to make up a full team.

As the head coach, I have lead national teams to 2019 World Championships, several Grand Prix, Oceania Championships and Pacific Games. Overall, results at the 2019 World Championships were the best in the last three World Championships with two top 8 and three top 16 finishes. In addition, part of my role includes running coaching seminars to develop and inform Australian coaches on current international trends and training techniques in international level competition.
